Seeking Christ With Others While Sharing the Christ Within Us

WHAT IS FAITH?

As defined in a dictionary Faith is complete trust or confidence in someone or something. It is also a belief that is not based on proof.

I searched the Book of Common Prayer for a definition of faith but came up short. Faith is mentioned many times in our Prayer Book – in Collects and Prayers primarily, but I was not able to find a definition of faith. The closest I could find was in the Outline of the Faith (commonly called the Catechism) which begins on page 845. (This is a must read for all Episcopalians!)

What is the Christian hope? (Page 861) tells us that "The Christian hope is to live with confidence in newness and fullness of life, and to await the coming of Christ in glory, and the completion of God's purpose for the world." This hope is definitely faith based – we believe without any proof that Christ will return and God has a plan for us and the world.

What, then, is our assurance as Christians? (Page 862) takes this hope one step further by reminding us that "Our assurance as Christians is that nothing, not even death, shall separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

We, as Christians and Episcopalians tend to think of faith primarily in terms of belief in God and Jesus Christ and all they stand for. But faith is not limited to religion. One of my friends recently wrote about faith as it regards to a football game: "A play happened where one player ran up toward the goal as fast as he could, reached a certain point, and turned, ready to catch the ball, already on its way to him. He had been slowed by a second, and so missed it. But a "flag" happened at the other end of the field. The penalty was to re-play! A penalty!!! On the replay -- exactly as before, but without the delay -- he turned with his arm open to the ball, and it went right into it!! This is the result of FAITH! He knew it was to be thrown to him; he knew when to turn to receive; and he caught it -- because of the discipline the two of them had gone through many, many times - prepared for this moment. Faith made it pay off!! Because of discipline!!! He did what discipline had taught; and what discipline had determined to happen, did happen."

This is a wonderful way to look at faith – even the part where the penalty was to try again. God gives us as many do-overs as we want!! That is part of our faith, too! I bring this up because we will be celebrating Easter on April 16. The day we believe changed everything for everyone. Jesus Christ rose from the dead. This by itself is a difficult concept to understand, let alone believe without proof. That is where the discipline my friend mentions is so important. Faith is important, but without discipline, faith can easily wane and become something we merely say rather than something we believe and live with our whole being.

The season of Lent, which leads to Easter, is our time to practice discipline. But it is not the only time. Let us make a habit of practicing our faith and exercising our discipline that these two, together, may bring us to a deeper knowledge of the love of God and strengthen our trust and confidence in God's love and mercy.

May God bless you in this holy season.



Always give to homeless

Pope discusses how to respond to beggars

VATICAN CITY — People who don't give money to the homeless because they think it will be spent on alcohol and not food should ask themselves what guilty pleasures they are secretly spending money on, Pope Francis said.

"There are many excuses" to justify why one doesn't lend a hand when asked by a person begging on the street, he said in an interview published the day before the beginning of Lent.

But giving something to some-



one in need "is always right," and it should be done with respect and compassion because "tossing money and not looking in (their) eyes is not a Christian" way of behaving, he said.

The interview, published Feb. 28, was conducted by the monthly magazine, "Scarp de' Tenis" (Tennis Shoes), which serves homeless and marginalized people in Milan and is run by the local and national Caritas branches. The pope was scheduled to visit Milan March 25.

Of the several questions the pope was asked, one focused on whether he thought giving money to people begging on the street was the right thing to do.

One thing people may tell themselves to feel better about not giving anything, the pope said, is "I give money and then he spends it on drinking a glass of wine."

But, the pope said, if "a glass of wine is the only happiness he has in life, that's OK. Instead, ask yourself what do you do on the sly? What happiness do you seek in secret?"

'You are luckier'

Or, another way to look at it, the pope said, is recognize how "you are luckier, with a house, a wife, children" and then ask why should the responsibility to help be pushed onto someone else.

The way one reaches out to the person asking for help is important, he said, and must be done "by looking them in the eyes and touching their hands."

When encountering people who live on the street, the pope said he always greets them and sometimes inquires about their lives and background.

It's important to be sincere because "people who live on the streets understand right away when the other person is really interested" in them as a person or when they just feel pity, he said.

When the interviewer asked why the pope thought the poor were capable of changing the world, he said that in Buenos Aires, he saw more solidarity in the slums than in less poor neighborhoods, where "I encountered more selfishness."

Also, he said, problems are more evident in the poor neighborhoods, for example with substance abuse, but only because it's more covered up in other neighborhoods" where users are "white-collar" abusers.
