#### **Seeking Christ With Others While Sharing the Christ Within Us**

#### From the Rector

There is a debate, although not a too serious one as to what is the "Most Wonderful Time of the Year". For some it is the Christmas Season, for others it's the lazy days of Summer and for others is the time when the "kids go back to School." Wherever you position yourself on that issue, time moves on and once again the seasons keep on changing.

For we Christians all around the world the New Year is upon us, that is the season of Advent when our Church year begins. During this year we will primarily read from the Gospel of Jesus Christ according to Luke the Evangelist. Luke will present to us the Good News of Jesus the Christ.

AS ALWAYS, WE BEGIN AGAIN: and so, it is with Advent, as we recall not only the ends of days and the beginning of the days of Jesus, Emmanuel "God with us."

The first Sunday of Advent we read:

Jesus said, "There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in a cloud' with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near." Luke 21:25-28.

The second Sunday of Advent we read:

"the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah," The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth; and all flesh shall see salvation of God." Luke 3:1-6

The third Sunday of Advent we read:

John said to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruits worthy of repentance." And the crowds asked him, "What then should we do?" In reply he said to them, "Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise." ... As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." Luke 3:7,8,10,11,15 and 16.

The fourth Sunday of Advent we read:

And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? For as soon as I heard your greeting, the child in my womb leaped for joy. And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord." Luke 1:41-49

#### THEN COMES CHRISTMAS

Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. There will be angels, shepherds, animals and finally visitors from the East who will come to see this Child who will be our Savior and Lord." Luke 2:1-20

We will once again remember, celebrate and rejoice in the wonderful things our God does for us!

I encourage you to enjoy every bit of the season of celebration that will surround us. Take pleasure in the twinkling lights, the beautiful displays and the hopes and dreams of the child within us all. Be gracious in our willingness to extend and receive hospitality. Share what you have and bless others as you are blessed.

The God who made us has given us a tremendous and immeasurable gift. The Creator has come among us in the person of the Son, the Word made flesh. Jesus for us, has become the Christ, the chosen one of God who bids us all to rejoice. This bidding further calls us to follow in the footsteps of Jesus the Christ. We are called to share in the Love of God for us, by in turn loving all as brothers and sisters.

May this Christmas season truly be a time of joy, peace, love and happiness for all!
