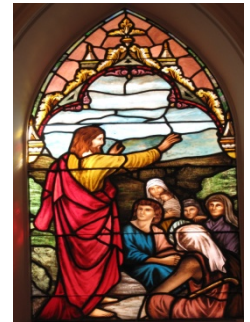
From the Rector

My Dear Church of the Holy Spirit Family,

The month of May in this Year B provides us with five weeks of Jesus' teaching which include the Feasts of the Ascension of Jesus, the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, and the celebration of Trinity Sunday.

Fifth Sunday of Easter, John 15:5-8

I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples.



Sixth Sunday of Easter, John 15:15-17

I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.

Seventh Sunday of Easter, John 17:14-19

I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth.

Pentecost Sunday, John 16:12-15

I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. All that the Father has is mine. For this reason, I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you.

Trinity Sunday, John 3:16-17

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.



We hear of our inter-connectedness with God the Creator, Jesus the Redeemer and the Holy Spirit Sustainer.

As a parish family we have similar connectedness, in that we share a common belief and strive to have our actions be reflective of these beliefs.

May God continue to bless us as a parish family and may we live in ways that share our blessings with all we meet.
