ROM THE RECTOR



My Dear Church of the Holy Spirit Family,

I hope you had an enjoyable Thanksgiving.

Time marches on and a New Year is here. For us Christians all around the world the New Year begins on December 3, 2023, as does the season of Advent when our Church year begins. During this year we will primarily read from the Gospel of Jesus Christ according to both the Evangelists Mark and John. They will present to us the Good News of Jesus the Christ.

AS ALWAYS, WE BEGIN AGAIN

And so, it is with Advent, as we recall not only the end of days and the beginning of the days of Jesus, Emmanuel "God with us"

Advent 1 - Mark 13:24-37

But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. Beware, keep alert; for you do not know when the time will come. It is like a man going on a journey, when he leaves home and puts his slaves in charge, each with his work, and commands the doorkeeper to be on the watch. Therefore, keep awake - for you do not know when the master of the house will come, in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or at dawn, or else he may find you asleep when he comes suddenly. And what I say to you I say to all: Keep awake.

Advent 2 - Mark 1:1-8

The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, as it is written in the prophet Isaiah. I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way; the voice of one crying out in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight."

Advent 3 - John 1:6-8,19-28

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. This is the testimony given by John when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" He confessed and did not deny it, but confessed, "I am not the Messiah." And they asked him, "What then? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the prophet?" He answered, "No." Then they said to him, "Who are you? Let us have an answer for those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" He said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, Make straight the way of the Lord, as the prophet Isaiah said."

Advent 4 - Luke 1:26-38

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." But she was much perplexed by his words. The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David."







THEN COMES CHRISTMAS

Luke 2:1-14

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see-- I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." Suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"

I invite you to plan and make some space in your life this Advent season to remember those you love and to be aware in our

day to day living that there will be opportunities to share your love with others who may find few people around them who love them. There are some who live in our Ocean City community who through a variety of circumstances have very few connections to others and are hard pressed to find reason to be joyful in the season. Maybe we can find an opportunity to spread the Love of God in this season. Simple acts of kindness, simple gifts to various charities and causes can help the joy of this season reach beyond our household or our church family.

May the Advent and Christmas Seasons be filled with the joy, peace, happiness, and love that you share, and you receive.



Advent Adult Study Program: EMBRACING AN ADULT FAITH

This is a five-session video discussion series for those who are seeking a

richer understanding of issues in contemporary Christian practice and theology. Who was Jesus? Who is God? What is salvation? How do we practice our faith? How do we live in community?

Our study program began on November 29, 2023. We will meet on each of the following Wednesdays during Advent. Sessions are in the afternoon at 1 p.m. and in the evening at 6 p.m. Sessions run between 60 and 90 minutes. We gather in the parish hall and we may share a snack or light supper, then view of one session of the DVD followed by an educational discussion and sharing of thoughts for those who wish.

We are using a DVD: **Embracing an Adult Faith - Marcus Borg on What it Means to be Christian.** Marcus Joel Borg (March 11, 1942 - January 21, 2015) was an American New Testament scholar and theologian. He was among the most widely known and influential voices in Progressive Christianity.





CHRISTMAS OUTREACH WITH WORCESTER G.O.L.D. (Giving Other Lives Dignity)

We are working with Worcester G.O.L.D. for our annual Christmas Angel Tree program. Tags with the names of children and gift requests are available at the church. Please use the tag to label your gifts. All tags should be loosely attached, as they will be replaced before delivery.

Monetary donations are always welcome to purchase gifts. Donations can be placed in the collection plate on Sunday. The Ocean Cluster of Churches, comprising St. Paul's Berlin, St. Paul's by-the-Sea and Church of the Holy Spirit, is planning its annual Christmas gift bag (we switched to bags a couple of years ago, as we received too many items for traditional Christmas boxes) drive for the Hope4Recovery House. The House assists men who are in recovery from addiction. The Cluster has been supporting this mission for several years, mostly in the form of monthly dinners which we prepare, take to the House and share with residents.

In the bags, we supply T-shirts, socks, and non-liquid toiletries. We currently have a lot of T-shirts on hand, as well as a few pairs of socks. More socks would be welcome, as well as hats, gloves, and mufflers. In addition, we supply games, both for individuals and for the house, and other amusements. Adult coloring books are welcome (we do have colored pencils on hand). And of course candy and other sweet treats! There are 10 residents; we try to collect enough to fill 12 bags, the extras to be used in case new men move in.

We will be collecting items for the gift bags ending December 17, after which we will fill the bags and deliver them to the House.

If you would like to support these efforts and feel like shopping, items can be dropped off at your church. If you would like to support these efforts and do not feel like shopping, checks are always welcome. Make them out to your church and put Hope4Recovery (or just H4R) on the memo line so the money will come to the right place.


