**FROM THE RECTOR** 



#### My Dear Church of the Holy Spirit Family,

Here we are once again, while still within the twelve days of Christmas, celebrating the Birth of Jesus and awaiting the celebration of the Epiphany, the arrival of the Magi (the Wise Men) with the gifts to the Child Jesus and his Mother. From there the Magi detour to avoid returning to King Herod, who we later learn did not wish to honor but to destroy the Child Jesus. (Matthew 2:1-18.) This is the story of "The Epiphany"!

January 7, 2024

Feast of the Epiphany

Matthew 2:7-12

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary, his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

While it is not recorded in our scriptures, I cannot help but believe that in their travels the Magi spoke of the Star, the Child and the prophecies of a Messiah issuing from the House of David, as well as the sense of joy and satisfaction they experienced upon the visit to the Child Jesus and His Mother. Through them The Child Jesus was revealed to the people beyond that little town of Bethlehem.

The Sunday scripture readings in the weeks that follow will leave Jesus, Mary, Joseph, the shepherds, sheep, the Wise Men from the East and the story of the infancy of Jesus.

During this liturgical year we will hear primarily from Mark the Evangelist; however John the Evangelist will occasionally be read on some Sundays to compensate and fill in for the brevity of Mark's account.

Our Gospel story then advances several decades to tell of Jesus beginning to invite some to join him as he begins his mission of traveling and preaching about God the Creator whom Jesus will refer to as my Father in heaven.

January 14, 2024

Epiphany II

John 1:43-51

Jesus decided to go to Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, "Follow me." Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found him about whom Moses in the law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus, son of Joseph from Nazareth." Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see." When Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward him, he said of him,







"Here is truly an Israelite in whom there is no deceit!" Nathanael asked him, "Where did you get to know me?" Jesus answered, "I saw you under the fig tree before Philip called you."

From here Jesus is off and running, teaching in the synagogue, choosing those who would become apostles, teaching large crowds on the mountain side and performing acts of healing. And before we know it, we are nearing the end of February and Ash Wednesday will be upon us and we will start our annual Lenten Journey.

January 21, 2024 Epiphany III Mark 1:14-20

After John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news."

As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the sea—for they were fishers. And Jesus said to them, "Follow me and I will make you fish for people." And immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went a little farther, he saw James, son of Zebedee and his brother John, who were in their boat mending the nets. Immediately he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men and followed him.

January 28, 2024 Epiphany IV Mark 1:21-28

Jesus and his disciples went to Capernaum; and when the sabbath came, he entered the synagogue and taught. They were astounded at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes. Just then there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit, and he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are, the Holy One of God." But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be silent, and come out of him!" And the unclean spirit, convulsing him and crying with a loud voice, came out of him. They were all amazed, and they kept on asking one another, "What is this? A new teaching—with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey him." At once his fame began to spread throughout the surrounding region of Galilee.

This is the rhythm of our Church liturgical (worship) calendar. We keep moving, hearing again the stories of our God. And in the rehearing our sacred stories, we strive to find ways that we can continue to live lives that are faithful to the message and life of Jesus.

May this new year be filled with wonderful experiences. May we find new opportunities to express the love we have received through the graciousness of God.

May God grant us the Blessing of safety and health for a love-filled 2024!




